Efan Electro is a young Welsh DJ and electronic music producer from Llanllechid, near Bethesda in Eryri / Snowdonia. Known for high-energy sets across house, trance, old skool rave and dance music, he combines modern club tracks with recognisable classics to create performances suited to festivals, youth events, family-friendly raves, support slots and specialist electronic music audiences.

Efan began DJing at the age of seven and has developed a strong live reputation, performing on professional DJ equipment with a clear focus on energy, structure and crowd response. As a producer, he releases Welsh and English-language electronic dance music and has received BBC Introducing Wales support, including multiple radio plays.
